The Conservation Commission is responsible for annual monitoring of conserved properties in Newmarket that the town holds an interest in. The easement monitoring process is to evaluate the condition of conserved properties and ensure that the terms of the conservation easement are not being violated. Violations of a conservation easement must be addressed to bring the property back into compliance. Monitoring reports must be forwarded to funding partners from the property acquisition.
