23 **5. Guest Speaker – Natch Greyes**

24 **Cris Blackstone** introduced out guest speaker this evening, Natch Greyes. Mr. Greyes is
25 a prominent municipal association attorney in New Hampshire who is also widely known for his
26 work with carnivorous plants and bogs. As a carnivorous plant enthusiast and active member of
27 the New England Carnivorous Plant Society (NECPS) <https://www.seacoastsarracenia.com/>, he
28 is also the author ‘Cultivating Carnivorous Plants’ and other publications
29 https://www.amazon.com/Cultivating-Carnivorous-Plants-Natch-Greyes/dp/1505891604/ref=sr_1_1?crid=2MZU7WIPO3O3I&keywords=natch+greyes&qid=1658165112&sprefix=Natch+Greyes%2Caps%2C80&sr=8-1. He is an avid gardener of
30 carnivorous plants as well. He described in detail the four species primarily found in New
31 England/New Hampshire. They include Pitcher Plants, Sundews, Bladderwort, and Butterwort.
32 He also described in detail the five ecosystems that carnivorous plants call home: Kettle Bogs,
33 Boreal Bogs, Atlantic White Cedar Bogs, Pine Barrens, and Sand Dunes. If one is looking for
34 carnivorous plants, you may find them in the areas where you find sheep laurel, mountain laurel,
35 cotton grass, and blueberries. They thrive in full sun, acid and moist terrain. The biggest threat to
36 their continued existence if human activity, habitat destruction, poaching, and climate change.

1 Carnivorous plants are grown successfully in containers and one local company excels at this –
2 Seacoast Sarracenia <https://www.seacoastsarracenia.com/> . He answered questions from the

7 **9. Bart McDonough, Town Planner- Proposed ConCom Budget FY24**

8 **Bart** is present this evening to address the proposed Conservation Commission Budget for FY24.
9 The budget was sent to members are part of the packet. He and **Ellen** met to discuss the increase
10 to several of the General Fund requests. The CC went over budget this year in several areas.
11 They propose increasing the recording secretary budget from \$2,000 to \$2,200 and dues would
12 increase from \$400 to \$500 (paying for NHACC). All other line items would stay the same. The
13 overall change would be an increase of \$2,900 to \$3,200. This is the time of year to make the
14 “ask”. **Cris Blackstone** would like to ask for \$100 to go toward the Conservation Connections
15 Event on October 15. **Bart** agreed to add that to the proposal. **Cris** described last year’s
16 successful event. It was discussed that this funding could come from general supplies and **Bart**
17 agreed to look into that for us. **Bart** also wanted to speak about opportunities to seek funding
18 through the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) process this year. He mentioned the monitoring
19 which must be completed and, since monitoring is a benefit to the Town, we could ask for help
20 with costs for trail maintenance, invasive species removal, infrastructure within the trails,
21 purchasing of property, planning documents (like a new prime wetlands map), and studies. He
22 would like the Conservation Commission to come up with some proposals for the CIP by the
23 next meeting. He also discussed grant opportunities. The Conservation Fund balance is \$79,340.
24 **Ellen** and **Bart** wanted to bring up the Land Use Change Tax which is currently split between
25 the Town and the ConCom (50-50). In other municipalities, 100% is typically given to the
26 ConCom. **Bart** says that we would need to have a conversation with the Town Manager. **Ellen**
27 wanted to bring up the fishing derby which is \$1,500 per year - perhaps there is a different way
28 of funding the expenditure. **Bart** will have an idea about properties which might be coming out
29 of current use at the next meeting after speaking with the Town Assessor.

31 **10. Committee/Board Reports**

32 **Planning Board:** **Jeff Goldknopf** asked **Bart** to speak about the PB. **Bart** said that at the next
33 meeting, the PB will be discussing a draft proposal on Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs). They
34 will also be looking at previous documents/minutes of past discussions about the re-zoning of N.
35 Main Street. They will also discuss the report by Stuart Arnette from the combined TC and PB
36 meeting on 11/20/2019.

37 **Town Council:** **Colin White** reported that the Town Council will discuss Resolution
38 2021/2022-37 - Sustainable Energy Goals for the Town of Newmarket at their next meeting on
39 July 20, 2022 (second reading). There was discussion about some verbiage – possibly to change
40 the word ‘commit’ to ‘aspire’ or ‘set a goal’.

41 **Ad hoc Riverfront Advisory Committee:** **Sam Kenney** reported the committee met on June 13
42 and will meet again on July 18. What the Committee has spent most of their time discussing is to
43 advance the living shoreline at Schanda Park more so than the issues surrounding the Moonlight
44 Brook culvert. It may be likely that the Committee will fracture the timeline and apply to the CIP
45 for the funds for the Moonlight Brook restorative work. They may apply for grant funds for the
46 Living Shoreline separately and be more successful.

11. Events

October 15, 2022: The 2022 Conservation Connections II Event. Aimee Gigandet will be letting us use the van again this year. They are still working on fabulous ideas to make this event successful.

Cris Blackstone has had a report back from Kerry Cronin, Library Director, about the Story Book walk installed at Piscassic River-Loiselle Conservation Area July 10 and 16. She is very grateful and has heard from so many residents (anecdotally) asking “when will the next book walk be?”.

Bart mentioned that, when **Ellen** was working for Durham, she created a book on each conservation property in Town which included everything about the property. **Melissa** mentioned that they have begun that process. **Bart** said that this might be another opportunity to seek funding for a consultant to help with that process.
